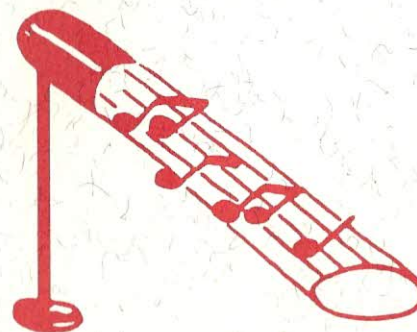

SHARON GIRARD (DRAMA DIRECTOR)

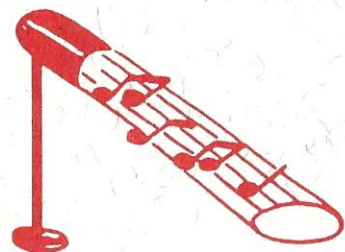
