

Synopsis of the Show

ANYTHING GOES, an amusing story wrapped about the magical score of Cole Porter, first appeared on Broadway in the mid-1930s and featured Ethel Merman. This is the 1962 revision with the same plot but additional songs. The show starts at the New York sailing of the U.S.S. AMERICAN bound for England, and the entire action takes place on board. Of chief interest to the reporters is Reno Sweeney, the famous evangelist-turnednightclub-singer, and her 4 "Angels." A friend has come to see Reno off and deliver a passport to his boss, J. B. Whitney. This is Billy Crocker, a young man on his way up in Wall Street, who drove around Central Park with Hope Harcourt one night and who has been searching for her unsuccessfully ever since. When he discovers that Hope, her mother and her fiance are on board, Billy decides to sail, too. Moonface Martin, Public Enemy No. 13, is able to supply Billy with a passport and cabin that Public Enemy No. 1 was to use. Bonnie, No. 1's moll, is enjoying to the fullest adventures at sea, while Reno, in an effort to give Billy a clear field with Hope, is weaving a spell about Sir Evelyn. Mrs. Harcourt is determined to have Sir Evelyn for her son-in-law, which leaves Billy only 5 days to win Hope while trying to elude the ship's officers with a variety of disguises.

Laurie is making her debut as a director of musicals with this show. She has previously stage-managed several Light Opera productions, including Oh, Coward!, I do, I Do, and this season's Shenandoah. Acting credits in-



clude roles as a scrubwoman in How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying, Nurse Anderson in Red Mask's Whose Life Is It Anyway?, Conrade in Much Ado About Nothing for the Station Theater in Champaign. and her favorite, Morgan Le Fay in Camelot. She is the middle link of a three-generation theater family, being the daughter of Mary Lou Spain and the mother of ace set-builder Tony Chambliss. She, Tony and husband Ed Chambliss live somewhere south of Oakwood. A former obituary writer and utility engineer, she is presently unemployed and looking for high-paying work to support her theater habit.

HAROLD FRENCH — Instrumental

Harold is currently serving as President of DLO for the fourth time. During his 25 year association with this organization, he has directed the music for Bue, Bue, Birdie, On a Clear Day You Can See Forever, Bells Are Ringing, Two by Two, The Pajama Game, and Some Enchanted Evening. Besides being in several shows, Harold has served on nearly all production

crews at some time, most notably set design and construction. Harold teaches instrumental music in the Westville School District and has taught in Vermilion county for 30 years. He received his B.S. and M.A. degrees in Music Education from Indiana State University and was active with The Sycamore Players there. Harold has also directed 2 Catlin community minstrels, a DLO summer revue and the Danville Municipal Band.



SUE DILL COLBY

Sue is a Physical Education major from Eastern Illinois University, with an emphasis on dance. She was involved with many college dance productions and has been a dancer in DLO's The Pajama Game and How to Succeed in Business. and Sunshine II's Cabaret. Sue is a Physical Education teacher and coach at Bismarck Grade School and is also self-employed as an aerobic dance instructor. She and her husband Terry live "up north of Bismarck."



CARLA HAYS, a 1983 graduate of Catlin High School, appeared in a variety of school musical productions and the play *Toga*, *Toga*. She studied voice with Linda McGee of Catlin and was in the DLO production of *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying*. She was one of the five soloists in our last show, *Some Enchanted Evening*. A sophomore at the University of Illinois,

Carla is a vocal performance major, studying with James Bailey. She is a member of the U of I Women's Glee Club and is employed by Paul Harris Stores in Champaign.



DAVID LAKER has been a member of Community Theater groups in Illinois, Indiana and Kentucky. He is currently finishing his first term on the DLO Board, is vice president of the organization, and was Producer for Some Enchanted Evening. Danville audiences have most recently seen Dave as the lead in Shenandoah, and previously in Camelot, Sugar, Oh, Coward and How to

Succeed in Business. . . , with DLO; and in the Red Mask productions of The Curious Savage, Play It Again, Sam, An Evening of One Acts, and last spring in his Katy Award winning role in The Paisley Convertible. Dave is presently employed as a waiter at O'Leary's Pub and spends his "spare time" renovating the barn in which he lives in Fithian into a house (which, he says, contributes to his lofty outlook on life).



JEFFEREY L. SPANN was one of the brothers in DLO's fall production of *Shenandoah*, and is looking forward to more shows in the future. He says, "It's a great experience and a chance to meet new people." Jeff is a graduate of Seeger Memorial High School in West Lebanon, IN. As a member of the Drama Club there, Jeff appeared in *Up the Down Staircase*, Cheaper by the Dozen,

and Flowers for Algernon a.k.a. Charley. He is employed as Warehouse Merchandiser with Target in Danville. Along with acting, Jeff enjoys photography and writing. He lives in West Lebanon with his parents, Deimar and Betty, and his sister Pat.

ERIN LUKE is appearing in her third DLO show, having previously been in Sugar and the daughter in Shenandoah. While in Danville High School, she was in their productions of The Music Man and My Fair Lady, and was a member of Singing Vikings and Madrigal Guys and Gals. Erin attended DACC for two years and is currently employed by Buchanan's Optical Service. She



plans to continue her schooling to earn a Liberal Arts Degree and definitely intends to keep music a major part of her life.

KATHLEEN L. SPAIN is a "veteran" of Danville Light Opera with eleven years and fourteen shows under her belt. Some of her favorite roles include Carrie Pipperidge in Carousel, Queen Guenevere in Camelot, and Sonia Walsk in They're Playing Our Song." Behind the scenes she finds another kind of joy on the directing staff. She has



choreographed four shows as well as serving as music director for two, the latter of which was this season's *Shenandoah*. Anything Goes provides a challenge, being a cast member and a director, but one she thoroughly enjoys.

PAT FRENCH has been with DLO for 25 years. Anything Goes is the 11th show she has been in and the 28th production she has been involved with. Pat is a past DLO Board member and has served on most of the committees and "support teams". For many years, DLO was a "family affair" with Pat, Harold, Alan and Jacki all working together on sets/costumes/lights/props. Their



all-time favorite show is still *Fiddler on the Roof*. Pat is on the Sales staff at Estad Products and enjoys talking to people all around the country and listening to the different accents and attitudes that come over the phone.

ANDREW RENNICK claims he was found in a small but expensive alien spacecraft. He was adopted by a mild mannered, elderly, midwestern couple and raised as their own. At age fifteen, he discovered he was not like other people and set out to become an actor. He appeared in DLO's West Side Story, attended Western Illinois University and mysteriously disappeared, only to

reappear in Red Mask's production of Sly Fox. In February he was kidnapped and sold to Danville Light Opera. He didn't object — said he had no other choice.




