CAMELOT

The court is agog with expectation as Guenevere, soon to be Queen, arrives at Camelot, but Arthur is so nervous and afraid that it takes Merlyn to oust him from the tree in which he has been hiding. But when they meet, they plan for a new order of chivalry — the Knights of the Round Table. News of this spreads rapidly, and Lancelot travels far from his native France to cast his lot with King Arthur. Despite their mutual love for King Arthur, Guenevere and Lancelot fall hopelessly in love and so seal their fate. In the meantime, Arthur's evil son Mordred arrives, plotting the King's downfall so that he might take over. When Guenevere is sentenced to burn at the stake, Lancelot rescues her and Arthur prepares to go to war. Seeing his hopes of world peace crumbling, Arthur sees success for the future in the aspirations of a young page and bids him tell the story of Camelot so that it may inspire future generations.



Camelot premiered on Broadway on December 3, 1960, and ran for 25 months (873 performances). DANVILLE LIGHT OPERA presented its first production of the show on October 28 and 29, 1966.


JIM WINGO (Arthur) is starring in his first DANVILLE LIGHT OPERA production. But Jim is no newcomer to the stage. Over the past 10 years, he has performed at Red Mask in such roles as Joseph Cantwell in *The Best Man*, Titus Savage in *Curious Savage*, Dirk Winston in *Mary, Mary*, and Billy Boylan in *Forty Carats*. Last summer, he played the title role in *Dracula*.

A graduate of Oregon State University, Jim is Systems Development Manager for Hyster Company. He and his wife, Lois, have two high-school-age children, Kristin and Ron



KATHLEEN SPAIN (Guenevere) is doing her eighth show for DANVILLE LIGHT OPERA. One of her previous roles was that of Carrie Pipperidge in Carousel (1978). which was preceded by appearances in South Pacific (1974), Applause, Gypsy, Oliver, and The Music Man (1977). While at Danville High School, she appeared in Camelot and played Fruma-Sarah in Fiddler on the Roof, Nellie Forbush in South Pacific, and Elaine Wheeler in Night Watch. Another community theatre credit is her portraval of Aldonza in Sunshine II. Ltd.'s production of Man of La Mancha. Her last affiliation with DLO was with the production staff of last season's Unsinkable Molly Brown, for which she served as choreographer. She sings with the Chancel Choir at Central Christian Church, where she also directed and taught for the Summer Parish Music Program, as well as directed the church's Junior Choir. She is also a former member of Sweet Adelines, in which she sang baritone.

Kathleen has a degree in elementary education from Illinois State University and is presently substitute teaching for the District 118 School System.



JERRY ROSS (Lancelot) is repeating the role he played in DLO's 1966 production of Camelot. Jerry was seen last year as Johnny "Leadville" Brown in The Unsinkable Molly Brown and has played major singing roles in 13 musical productions. Among his favorites for DLO are Billy Bigelow in Carousel (1978), Emile de Becque in South Pacific (1974), the title role in Li'l Abner, and Lt. Cable in South Pacific (1960). For Sunshine II, Ltd., he played Horace Vandergelder in Hello, Dolly! and, at the Little Theatre in Sullivan, appeared as Dr. Engle in The Student Prince. He is currently studying classical music in Champaign with Prof. Hans Gregory Ashbaker. Jerry is employed by Randolph School Supply, Inc., in Champaign. He and his wife, Marilyn, reside in Catlin and have three daughters.

J. EDWARD HANCOCK (Pellinore) has been active in theatre since he was eight. John, who majored in theatre arts at Carnegie Tech, was first seen by Danville audiences during the 1978-79 season, when he appeared as Sidney in Red Mask's production of *God's Favorite*. Since then he has participated in most of the city's community theatres. For Red Mask, he directed 6 Rms Riv Vu and Chapter Two, and for DLO, he stage managed West Side Story and directed The Sound of Music (1980). John last appeared as Victor Vallesco in Sunshine II's Barefoot in the Park. A fine arts appraiser, John is the father of Glen, 12. and Jaime. 7.



THOM REEVES (Merlyn) began his acting career in college, where he won the Best Supporting Actor award in 1955-56 from the National Collegiate Players for parts in *Oklahoma* and *The Happy Time* while attending Southeast Missouri State University. Other supporting and bit parts were held in *The Madwoman of Chaillot, Knickerbocker Holiday, Gold in the Hills, Visit to a Small Planet, Lillium, Cactus Flower,* and *Witness for the Prosecution.* Thom is a clinical psychologist in private practice at the Vermilion Medical Center.



LAURIE SPAIN CHAMBLISS (Morgan LeFey) is appearing in her first DANVILLE LIGHT OPERA production since *Gypsy* in 1975. She has also appeared in Red Mask productions. She has found Morgan an enjoyable character. "The woman thinks about nothing but sex, food, and deceit," Laurie says. "I could play the part in my sleep." Laurie lives with her husband, Ed, and son, Tony, somewhere northwest of Catlin. She works in the engineering department at Illinois Power Company.






