



Helen McDuffee 1914-2004

Each show was always "the best one ever!"

FROM THE DIRECTOR

Although it may not be common knowledge, "The Fantasticks" was the longest running musical in the world up until a few years ago. How, you may ask, could a show so little known have been so popular for so long? The answer is simple. It's a story that speaks to us all on our most basic human level. It speaks to our desires for love, romance and adventure. It also touches the reality of our lives with our heartaches, disappointment and having to learn to hard lessons in life. The story may be told in a, somewhat, unconventional way, but it is a story where we can all identify a little piece of ourselves within.

The story of "The Fantasticks" follows the romance between Matt and Luisa. They are two young people who remind us all of our first romance. They are kept apart by their fathers which only fuels their love. Hucklebee and Bellomy, their fathers, have plans of their own, though, as they know that children only want what they can't have and pretend to feud in an attempt to get the children together. How many clever parents haven't considered this? The only obstacle now is how to end the feud? Enter El Gallo and his band of helpers. El Gallo has already overseen all of this and provides them with a scene in which to end the feud and deliver a happy ending. Or so they think.

The "happy" family soon discovers, though, that things are not all roses in the sunlight. Suddenly all the flaws rear their ugly heads. The family splits to go their separate ways as El Gallo steps in once again to guide them through the tough lessons in life they must learn to fully appreciate the things they had all along. As El Gallo says, "why we all must die a bit... before we grow again." We've all been there and we've all lived through it. I think that if you look very closely you may just see a bit of yourself up there on that stage. A part of you that you once knew. A part of you that still lives in your heart somewhere. Try to remember...
