

"FIDDLER ON THE ROOF"

The setting is Anatevka, an impoverished peasant town in Tzarist Russia, populated largely by hard-working Jewish families. We are introduced to Tevye, the dairyman - a pious man who has raised his five daughters with the aid of quotations from the Scriptures, most of which he invents himself. The people of Anatevka are simple and close to the earth. They hear little news of the outside world, and their lives are governed strictly by the age-old laws of Tradition.

Yente, the matchmaker, goes to Tevye's house to tell his wife Golde that the town's wealthiest citizen, Lazar Wolf, the butcher, wants to marry their eldest daughter, Tzeitel. Golde is delighted at the prospect of such a good catch for Tzeitel, despite the fact that Lazar Wolf is vulgar and as old as Tevye himself.

On his way home for Sabbath dinner, Tevye encounters Perchik, a young and aspiring social reformer. Although Tevye is poor, he desires his girls to grow up learned in the ways of the Good Book and invites Perchik to tutor them in exchange for room and board.

Tevye meets Lazar Wolf at the local inn and agrees to let the butcher marry Tzeitel if he promises to keep her in comfort. While Tevye is offering Tzeitel's hand to Lazar Wolf, the girl is promising her own hand to a meek and miserably poor little tailor named Motel. When they inform Tevye of their bethrothal plans, he is, at first, shocked that they have broken the tradition which demands that the papa choose the husband for the daughter. But, realizing that their love is deep, he gives his blessing.

Their wedding is a joyous traditional event, but its gaiety is interrupted by the police who begin to carry out the threatened purge by smashing the gifts and the furnishings of the Jewish homes. For the first time, Tevye has no suitable quotation from the Scriptures but simply looks to God for some explanation.

Motel and Tzeitel are poor but happy in their marriage and Perchik and Hodel are very much in love. For some time, Perchik has expressed deep resentment of Tzar's cruelty. He informs Tevye that he wants to marry Hodel but must immediately join his compatriots in their revolutionary social activities. Presently news arrives that Perchik has been arrested in Kiev and has been sent to Sibera. Hodel, wanting to be near her man, decides to join him.

Now the safe world which Tevye has struggled so hard to build for his family receives its greatest blow. The Tzar has ordered all Jews to evacuate their age-old homes in Anatevka and move elsewhere. The villagers begin to move out to all corners of the globe. Tevye's few belongings are packed on his cart, as he and his family prepare to move off to another land where they feel there will be no hatred, no cruelty, no poverty; they begin their long journey to America.
