

"GUYS & DOLLS"

The plot of "Guys & Dolls" centers around a little known Damon Runyon story, "The Idyll of Sarah Brown", but it was enriched by a horde of Runyon's typical Broadway characters: Nathan Detroit, Sky Masterson, Big Jule, Benny Southstreet, Harry the Horse, and Nicely-Nicely Johnson, among others. All of them are gamblers, and the action concerns them, their girls and their troubles -the chief trouble being the difficulty of deciding between the rolling of the dice and the beating of the heart. There are two lone stories, equally wacky. The first involves Nathan Detroit, a small but hot-shot operator, proprietor of "The Oldest Established Permanent Floating Crap Game in New York"-which is incidentally, the title of one of the most hilarious songs in the show. Detroit is devoted to Miss Adelaide, a night club canary. They have been engaged for 14 years but their nuptials have been continually postponed because of Nathan's sudden need to dash off to the Saratoga race track, or disappear in other mysterious ways. The other romance concerns Sky Masterson, a big-time, free-living, free-loving plunger - a night-hawk, as he explains in the nocturnal "My Time of Day" - and Sarah Brown, a Salvation Army lass, head of the gallant but rundown Save-a-Soul Mission. Complications ensue but, with a nod to the proverb, the course of true love is smoothed out along the way.

Some of the more well-known songs include "A Bushel and a Peck", "If I Were a Bell", "My Time of Day", "I've Never Been In Love Before" and "Luck Be a Lady". This promises to be a musical transformation to another galaxy, the universe of the underworld!

Al Capp's world famous characters have been placed in a gay, colorful musical extravaganza. The plot is a satisfying mixture of hill-billy nonsense and sharp, critical humor. Word has been sent down from Washington that the citizens of Dogpatch must all evacuate their mountain homes. Dogpatch has been selected as the most unnecessary town in the country, and therefore the perfect site for nuclear tests. It appears that something useful is found when Mammy Yokum produces her secret formula of Yokumberry tonic which makes muscle men of weaklings. However, General Bullmoose, a sly conniving politician, sets a sultry siren and Evil Eye Fleagle with his double whammy to work on Li'l Abner, hoping to wheedle Mammy's secret formula from him. The citizens of Dogpatch, after a trip to Washington, foil his plan, and everybody settles down for a special life of rustic simplicity in Dogpatch, U.S.A....

The wonderful tunes include Abner and Daisy's gentle duet, "Namely You," a dreamy ballad "If I Had My Druthers," the hilarious show-stopper "Jubilation T. Cornpone", General Bullmoose's "Progress Is The Root Of All Evil" and the political satire "The Country's In The Very Best Of Hands". The Sadie Hawkins Day Ballet and fine choral work contribute to making "Li'l Abner" one of the classics of American musicals.


