MEET THE CAST

ROGER BIGGS (Lon Smith) — Roger is appearing in his first DLO show. At Georgetown High School he was involved in the Drama Club and performed in numerous plays. Roger works at Victorian Rose.

ALICE DOWNING (Mrs. Smith) — This production marks Alice's third on-stage performance with DLO as well as numerous backstage positions.
