MORE ABOUT "THE MUSIC MAN"......

"The Music Man", a musical comedy concerned with the life of a small Iowa city in 1912, a gentle, sunlit time, opened on the night of December 19, 1957, on Broadway.

The story is largely a recapitulation, tenderly altered in recollection and shaped to the exigencies of musical comedy, of things that happened to Willson and about him in Mason City (which he calls "River City") when he was ten years old. It is the story of a rascally but attractive salesman of musical instruments and band uniforms, shuttling about the Midwest and prevailing on small town people to outfit school bands on the promise of teaching its members to play. He cannot read a note and invariably leaves town on a through freight after (a) collecting his money, and (b) breaking a few local hearts. In River City, however, he (a) collects his money; (b) falls truly in love with the local librarian; (c) is exposed and (d) forgiven by townspeople and librarian alike when it becomes apparent that the city is a happier one, if poorer, for his presence. 
