We hope you will all show your interest in the future of Danville Light Opera by attending this very important meeting.



Meanwhile, the Governor arrives and finds that Gretchen's aunt is equally as wealthy—and is content to wed her instead. Gretchen is restored to her lover, who is found to be heir to a large English estate, and all rejoice in a happy wedding day.
