MEET THE CAST

JUSTIN VICKERS (DON LOCKWOOD)

Justin is making his 2nd appearance with DLO. His first was three seasons ago as Eddie Ryan in "BLACK PATENT LEATHER SHOES". He has also appeared in "BYE-BYE BIRDIE" and "MUSIC MAN". As a Junior at D.H.S., he played Curly in "OKLA-HOMA". Justin is serving his 2nd term as President of the Theatre Guild and is directing the Guild's production of Agatha Christie's, "TEN LITTLE INDIANS". Justin was selected for the All State Honors Chorus last year and is a member of the Contemporaires at the high school. In the fall of 1992, he plans on attending the School of Fine Applied Arts at the University of Illinois.

JULIE SWINFORD (KATHY SELDEN)

Julie is making her debut with DLO. She takes voice lessons from Mrs. Nancy Sigafoose of Danville. She is a member of the Bismarck-Henning concert band, chorus and show choir, Drama Club, Scholastic Bowl, Math Team, Devilettes, and is Flag Squad Sergeant for the Blue Devils Marching Band. Last year Julie attended the IMEA District Festival at ISU and was given a solo in the Westville County Chorus Festival last spring. She hopes to attend the U of I as a voice major when she graduates from BHHS, where she is currently a junior.

DAVE YOUHAS (COSMO BROWN)

This is Dave's 6th appearance on the DLO Stage, where he has played everything from a sadomasochistic dentist to a dancing Russian spy. He is studying electronics at DACC and is owner and operator of EXOTIC AUDIO, a disc jockey service. His hobbies include magic, cooking and woodworking. He was also responsible for the set design and construction of DLO's production of "PUMP BOYS AND DINETTES" and Red Mask's "LOVE, SEX AND THE IRS".

MARIOLGA FERNANDEZ LOCKLIN (LINA LAMONT)

Mariolga moved to the Danville area from south Florida in 1990. She now teaches Rhetoric at DACC and works as a weekend copy editor at the Commercial-News, where her husband, Steve, is Executive Sports Editor. She volunteers her free time to the YWCA Women's Shelter. Her credits include singing with the Vermilion Festival Chorus and performances with The Choral Park Chamber Singers in Miami, FL.

RON McDANIEL (R.F. SIMPSON)

Ron first appeared on the DLO Stage exactly 30 years ago in "ANNIE GET YOUR GUN". Since then he has played major and supporting singing and nonsinging roles in 29 DLO musicals. If anyone has avoided being type-cast, it's Ron. His parts have ranged from the snooty Lutz in "THE STUDENT PRINCE", to the naive Cornelius Hackl in "HELLO DOLLY", to President Franklin Roosevelt in "ANNIE". In addition, he has directed for DLO and acted in and directed plays for Red Mask. Ron is past president of DLO and is currently its treasurer. Offstage, he is Vice-President-Editorial of Interstate Publishers, Inc.
