



### THE DIRECTORS

**JERRY RUDD** (**Dramatics Director**) — This is the third Danville Light Opera production for Jerry to be involved with. His first D.L.O. show was "Once Upon a Mattress" in which he played the Wizard. Last season he directed the Spring show "Sugar". Jerry has participated in 22 productions, including "Applause", "Gypsy", "Mame", and "West Side Story". He holds a bachelor's degree in secondary education from Indiana University and is a veteran thespian.

**STANLEY BUTTS (Musical Director)** — Stanley is a newcomer to Danville Light Opera. He is a graduate of the University of Illinois with a Bachelor of Science in music education. Stanley appeared in "Tremonisha", "Purlie", and "Porgy and Bess". Stanley is starting his second year of teaching at East Park Jr. High School, is the director of Purdue Black Voices of Inspiration, director of the youth choir at the Greater Shiloh Baptist Church in Danville, and the choir director at St. Luke C.M.E. Church in Champaign.

**MARILYN NELSON (Choreographer)** — Marilyn is the new owner of the Cromwell School of Dance. She was both a student and instructor under Catherine Cromwell. Marilyn studied dance at the University of Illinois and at the National Academy of Arts in Champaign. This is not Marilyn's first involvement with Danville Light Opera. She was in the chorus of "Oliver", protrayed Louise and performed a spectacular ballet in "Carousel", and has choreographed "Once Upon a Mattress", and "Sugar". During the past year, Marilyn choreographed dances for the Royalettes "Winter Frolic" and D.H.S.'s "Oklahoma!". Marilyn is also looking forward to her upcoming marriage next year. J. EDWARD HANCOCK (Stage Manager) — This is John's second show with Danville Light Opera as stage manager, his first being last seasons "Sugar". He is also active with RED MASK and portrayed the part of Sidney in "Gods Favorite". John directed last Spring's production of "Lil Abner" at Schlarman High School. John majored in acting and directing at Carnige Tech. He has performed a variety of roles and has directed 31 shows.

### **SYNOPSIS**

Contrary to popular belief, when "West Side Story" opened on Braodway at the Winter Garden Theater, on September 26, 1957, the production received mixed notices. The famous critic, Brooks Atkinson, Wrote: "Although the material is horrifying, the workmanship is admirable." The show's creators had taken the most dangerous of gambles: they dared to be different. New York audiences had been conditioned to musicals with light, bubbly plots, colorful scenery, and a happy ending. "West Side Story" defied all these conventional patterns and the result was jarring to audiences. Ironically it was this electrifying difference from other Broadway offerings that helped the show survive. The fingersnapping, lurching, venomous dancers that have become familiar to theatergoers today, were excitingly unique in 1957. Young people, in particular, flocked to the show claiming that it was magnificent and one with which they could relate.

After the show closed on Broadway, it toured to sold-out houses across the country and returned to Broadway for another two years. Critics who were hesitant about the show originally raved, while those who liked it four years earlier hailed it a masterpiece.

In 1961, the motion picture version was shot on location in New York City and featured many actors from several road companies of the show. The original show was painstakingly reproduced with a minimum of changes and the results were sensational. The movie won the Academy Award for best picture along with nine other Oscars. Once again the show's popularity skyrocketed to a higher level than before.

Seven years later, "West Side Story" was revived at Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts in New York City. (This remarkable complex dedicated to the presentation of musical theater had had to postpone construction seven years earlier while the film version of "West Side Story" was shot on location at the same site.)

Finally the toughest test of all is that of time. "West Side Story" continues to amuse, horrify, and move audiences today just as it did twenty years ago. Like so many other works of art, it seems to improve with age. Taking this into consideration, I find myself forced to agree with the New York critics, although "West Side Story" is daringly unique, it is undoubtedly a master piece of the American musical theater.




